Emissions reduction measures

In order to continue our progress to achieving Net Zero, we have adopted the following carbon reduction measures:

- In all our contracts we will reduce as much waste as possible and recycle all waste that can be recycled. We reuse cardboard packaging from suppliers when we send out parcels to our customers.
- We send and receive invoices via email rather than post
- We purchase items locally where possible
- We have installed new machinery at our premises that is more energy efficient

In the future we hope to implement further measures such as:

- Installation of solar panels on our buildings/premises within the next 12-18 months
- We will further encourage employees to cycle to work
- We will investigate the feasibility to replace our existing hybrid vehicles with fully electric vehicles over next 24 months.
